SACRAMENTO HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY NAMES DAVIS HOUSING VETERAN NANCY CONK AS DIRECTOR OF HOUSING POLICY AND DEVELOPMENT

(SACRAMENTO, CA: July 18, 2006) — Nancy Conk, who served as director of the Community Housing Opportunities Corporation (CHOC) in Davis for the past decade, has been named director of Housing Policy and Development for the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency (SHRA).

In her new job, which begins on Aug. 1, Conk will not only help shape and oversee SHRA's housing production and preservation policies but will also guide the development of affordable housing in both the city and county of Sacramento. Her duties will include managing all of SHRA's housing finance programs as well as the production of new housing under the city's Mixed Income Housing Ordinance, the county's Affordable Housing Ordinance, and the city and county's 10-Year Plan to End Chronic Homelessness.

"Nancy's experience and leadership skills will be a great asset to our agency," said SHRA Executive Director Anne M. Moore. "She has more than 20 years of professional experience in affordable housing development and organizational leadership. We're extremely pleased to have her on our team."

As the executive director of CHOC, Conk oversaw new development, property management, asset management, resident services and corporate activities. She was also responsible for the financial and management oversight of 12 affiliated entities, controlling a \$79 million portfolio of housing for multi-family rental, mobile home park, Single Room Occupancy (SRO), and special needs.

Conk previously worked at the Santa Barbara Community Housing Opportunities Corporation for six years, which included five years as the organization's executive director.

SHRA (www.shra.org) is a Joint Powers Authority created by the City and County of Sacramento to represent both jurisdictions for affordable housing and community redevelopment needs. The Agency is the leading public developer of affordable housing and oversees residential and commercial revitalization activities in 14 redevelopment areas throughout the City and County. SHRA has a FY 2006 budget of \$227 million and approximately 308 employees. The Agency owns and manages 3,400 units of public housing and is one of the largest landlords in Sacramento. SHRA also administers approximately 11,000 rental assisted vouchers per month.
