<p>Quarterly Activities/ Project Description</p> <p>The Township 9 project is design of infrastructure to support 179 units of affordable housing units. Improvements to Richards Boulevard, D Street, E Street and F Street are to be included in the scope of work. Additional design work was amended to the contract as required to be completed for the affordable housing. During the second quarter 2012, construction continued on North 7th Street, Richards Boulevard, Riverfront Drive, Streets D, E, F, Signature and A. Landscape work began on North 7th Street and Richards Boulevard. Work began on undergrounding utility lines on North 7th Street and Richards Boulevard. CDBG funds were used advance the design of these improvements. Design of Riverfront Park is continuing. An additional \$96,365.82 of CDBG - R funding was added to the project, that was not used in the La Valentina Project.</p> <p>The La Valentina Project is a mixed use project of commercial space and affordable housing. All work funded with CDBG R was completed in third quarter. In the first quarter of 2012 received final and paid final invoice. Project construction will be complete during the summer of 2012.</p>
