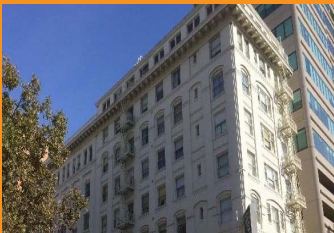

Guest Services



- Volunteers of America (VOA), the shelter operator, provides case management, meals, rehousing and service coordination
- Elica, a medical provider, has a rotating schedule onsite to administer full behavioral and medical service consultations
- Wellspace, a medical provider, has a rotating schedule onsite to provide nursing triage services
- Sacramento County's Alcohol and Drug Prevention & Treatment Services has a rotating schedule onsite to assist guests

Building Condition



- 180+ feet of sewer line was repaired
- Air condition issues resolved and repairs complete
- Two entrances to the Hotel now consolidated to one controlled access
- Proactive measures to test the heating system are underway
- A leak occurred in the guest lobby, but it was controlled
- Scheduled water shutoffs on Monday and Tuesday from 11am-2:30pm
- Elevator is still on schedule for repairs to be completed by mid-October
- Installation of new toilets for community bathrooms is in the final stage of completion
- Pest control continues with regular treatment of all rooms for preventative treatment
- There were two incidents of floods this week and repairs are underway

Relocation of Residents



- LifeSteps is now assisting the Relocation Consultant (*Overland, Pacific and Cutler*) to provide additional assistance to residents transitioning to a new home
- 12 residents received relocation benefits and moved to their new homes
- 3 moved out without assistance
- 1 evicted
- 64 residents remain
