Guest and Re-housing



- 1 guest has been successfully rehoused and exited from CP
- Guests services provided:
 - Housing application assistance
 - Connection to medical providers
 - Alcohol and Drug Counseling
 - Coaching
 - Offsite behavioral health services

Building Condition



- •On Monday 9/16, water was shutoff for several hours to work on repairs. This was the only day this week water was shut off.
- •A maintenance schedule has been developed so residents and guests can plan for water shut-offs accordingly
- •More than 1100 sprinkler heads have been replaced has been completed for all room floors, common areas and balcony.
- •Security camera installation is compete and on-line.
- •Flood mitigation is almost complete for water damage from a 6th floor tub overflow
- •Water leaks in the HVAC system were addressed
- •Elevator repair is scheduled to be completed mid-October; new motor has arrived but additional shipments of remaining parts are pending

Relocation of Residents



- Regular resident meetings continue at CP to discuss relocation and residents' concerns
- 4 residents received relocation benefits and moved to their new homes
- 3 moved out without assistance
- 1 evicted
- 72 residents remain
