

REGIONAL NEEDS

- 39,040/0-30% area median income renter households are severely cost burdened
- 5,570 people experiencing homelessness (2019 PIT count)
- 10,450 elderly renters & 11,035 elderly owners
 Severely cost burdened
- 1 in 3 households with a member with a disability live in homes that do not meet their accessibility needs



FAIR HOUSING BARRIERS

- Segregation disproportionate housing needs and differences in economic opportunity
- Affordable rental options increasingly limited
- Residents with disabilities lack access to affordable, accessible housing, services
- Stricter rental policies further limit options
- Homeownership disparities to accessing
- Public transportation limited & costly
- Educational inequities persist in the region
- Disparities in labor market engagement



FIVE-YEAR PRIORITIES & GOALS

High Priority Needs

- Improve Neighborhoods: historical disinvestment, underserved neighborhoods
- Better accessibility e.g., sidewalks, and service facilities
- Preserve existing, affordable housing
- Improved housing options & services for people with special needs and experiencing homelessness

Housing: new affordable units (L/VL) and preserve existing

Special Needs: Elderly, HIV/AIDS individuals, substance issues

Neighborhood: Equity across all, improve accessibility
