- Air conditioner for the sleeping areas stopped working this week, fans were provided and repairs made the same day. Air conditioning in the rooms continues to be a concern and options are being evaluated. The air conditioner in the Community Room continues to function well.

### Relocation of Residents



- 51 residents received relocation benefits and moved to their new homes:
  - \* Sacramento County: 35
  - \* Yolo County: 12
  - \* Out of State: 1
  - \* Other County in CA: 3
- 11 moved out without assistance
- 18 residents remain
