Guests' Success— PYTD

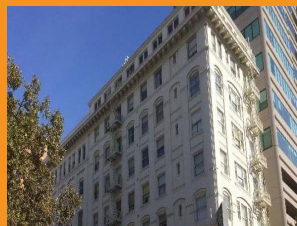
Housed

- 106 guests have moved into Permanent Housing (Primarily in Sacramento County)
- 3 guests staying with friends and family on a temporary basis
- 5 guest moved into transitional housing

Building Condition



- The air conditioning system serving the sleeping areas is not functioning properly. The air conditioner in the Community Room continues to keep that area cool. Measures are being taken to help guests stay cool.
- Two windows in the vacant Capitol Mini Mart were broken during the protests, but the hotel was unharmed. Plywood was installed over the windows to prevent future damage.
- The elevator stopped working last weekend, but the repair company would not allow their staff to enter the downtown area due to safety concerns following the protests. The repair has now been scheduled.

Relocation of Residents



- 52 residents received relocation benefits and moved to their new homes:
 - * Sacramento County: 35
 - * Yolo County: 13
 - * Out of State: 1
 - * Other County in CA: 3
- 11 moved out without assistance
- 17 residents remain
