### **CDBG Objectives**

  - Affordable Housing
    - Multifamily Rehabilitation
    - Emergency Repair Program
  - Public Facilities/Infrastructure



- Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements
- Public Services
  - Senior Services
  - Homeless Shelters







# Must Meet a National Objective

- Low and moderate-income area benefit
  - Primarily residential and at least 51% l/m income
- Low and moderate-income limited clientele
  - Individuals/households at or below 80% Area Median Income
- Low and moderate-income housing
  - Individuals/households at or below 80% Area Median Income



## **Major Eligible Activities**

- Public Facility/Infrastructure Improvements
- Public Services
- Acquisition
- Clearance and Remediation Activities
- Homeownership Assistance
- Planning and Administration
- Environmental Studies



### **Major Ineligible Activities**

- General government buildings and expenses
- Operating and maintenance expenses (nonpublic services)
- Purchase of construction equipment and furnishings
- Income Payments
- New housing construction
- Political and religious activities
- Supplanting of funds
- Regional Parks and facilities
