

2022 SHRA Proposed Budget - \$347.1 Appropriations - How The Money Will Be Used?









PANDEMIC RESPONSE Internal/External for Staff and Residents



Meal delivery to seniors in partnership with City of Sacramento Great Plates program Established policies and protocols for a safe work environment

Implemented telework scheduling and relocated staff to safe-distanced workspaces.

Achieved favorable employee vaccination response

Provided resident vaccination clinics, and Q&A sessions with health experts via Zoom

Sacramento Emergency Rental Assistance Program (SERA)





- Opened program Feb March 2021;
 reopened May 2021 to present.
- Pays past due rent and utilities for renters impacted by COVID-19.
- Landlords can apply on behalf of tenants.
- Partnering with 14 Community Based Organizations.

PUBLIC HOUSINGRental Assistance Demonstration Program (RAD)



Perry Avenue community after rehab. 10 threebedroom units, new siding, doors, windows, flooring, AC units, kitchen/bath improvements, plus exterior landscape improvements, etc.

- Allows conversion of public housing to Section 8 project based platform
- Allows leveraging of debt with private investors for long term sustainability
- 7 -10 year development pipeline
- 1,247 total units to be converted to Section 8
- 124 units completed in 2021
