- Purchased the building July 12, 2019
- Planned to apply for tax credits in 2020




Need for Housing

Meanwhile, the 2019 Point In Time Count reported:

- 5,570 homeless each night
- 70% of individuals experiencing homelessness are unsheltered
- 93% of the homeless in Sacramento County are from Sacramento County
- 30% of the homeless sleeping outside are over the age of 50
- 30% of the people experiencing homelessness met the definition of "chronic homelessness."






Capitol Park Hotel Occupancy







Turnover Why do guests leave?




