

HOMEKEY Highlights

Provides funding to cities, counties, and other local entities, including housing authorities to convert motels, hotels, and other nonresidential structures into permanent supportive housing and/or transitional housing for the State's homeless population.





Portfolio Management & Compliance

Managed:

- 2020 \$360M portfolio of 980+ loans
- 2021 \$380M portfolio of 960+ loans

Processed:

 18 loan subordination requests for existing single family home loans in 2020 and 48 in 2021.

🔿 Audited:

 Approx. 2000 Tenant files annually, ensuring compliance with income eligibility and property management procedures



Monitored:

- Resident services at multifamily properties
- Compliance of over 963 single family home loans in 2020 and 577 in 2021


