


The Housing Authority of the County of Sacramento was awarded 494 Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHVs) to provide rental assistance to families and individuals who are homeless or at risk of homelessness or who are fleeing domestic violence. 









Program Year to Date - Applications













Demographics of Vouchers Issued









Program Year to Date - Age of Head of Houshold










Zip Codes of Newly Housed Participants

*Definitions: (please refer to 24 CFR 578.3 for the full definitions. An abbreviated version is found below)

<u>Chronically homeless</u>: a homeless individual with a disability who has been continuously homeless for at least 12 months or 4 times over the past 3 years totaling at least 12 months.

Homeless: an individual or family who lacks a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence

<u>Recently homeless</u>: families or individuals who were previously homeless but are currently receiving temporary housing assistance

<u>At Risk of Becoming Homeless</u>: An extremely low income (at or below 30% area median income) individual or family without resources or support whose housing is unstable

<u>Rapid Rehousing</u>: Typically short-term intervention to provide housing relocation and stabilization services to move an individual quickly into stable permanent housing (see 24 CFR 576.104)

<u>Move On</u>: Previous homeless individuals and families who are living in housing with supportive services and need an affordable housing option so they can move out of supportive housing to independent housing, creating housing opportunities for other persons experiencing homelessness.

<u>Domestic Violence Survivors</u>: Individuals or families who are fleeing or attempting flee domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking or human trafficking
